Snowdonia

Visit the Snowdonia National Park in North Wales which is home to Snowdon, the highest mountain in England and Wales at 3560ft.

On Saturday, we will climb Snowdon. We are planning on taking the Snowdon Ranger Path, thought to be the oldest of the six classic routes up to the summit and one of the easier ones. The path is named after John Morton ‘the Snowdon Ranger’, who guided people to the top of Snowdon in the 19th century.



The final stretch offers beautiful views of mountain lakes and the ridges of Crib Goch and Y Lliwedd which make up the Snowdon Horseshoe.

Sunday’s walk will be not quite as high but the scenery will be just as impressive, with many more mountain lakes. We will round off the weekend with a pub dinner on our way back to Oxford.



Equipment: Please bring a comfortable pair of walking boots, waterproof coat and trousers (can be borrowed from OUWC), sleeping bag (can also be borrowed), some extra layers, a water bottle and a small rucksack for walking with. Please also bring some money for two pub dinners (Fri and Sun evening). All other food will be provided.
