## Cheddar Gorge

Cheddar Gorge is a 450 feet limestone gorge lying on the southern edge of the Mendip Hills near the village of Cheddar in Somerset, England. This dramatic gorge was formed by meltwater floods during the cold periglacial periods which have occurred over the last 1.2 million years.



We will take an approximately 16km circular route along the gorge and through the Mendip Hills. We will start along the top of the gorge to admire its great splendor before following the valley. After leaving the valley we will explore part of the hills with some lovely views, before looping back to Cheddar.
