The Malvern Hills offer panoramic views of the Severn Valley and parts of thirteen counties. They have been designated an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The Malverns are formed of some of the oldest rocks in Britain. Being largely igneous rocks, their reduced erosion has resulted in these hills standing out significantly compared to the surrounding countryside.

The walk will feature the Herefordshire and Worcestershire Beacons, with the latter being the highest point in the Malverns. We will also pass several natural springs for which the local town of Great Malvern was initially famous for. We will then finish with dinner in a local pub.

All members welcome however priority will be given to new club members. Hope you can join us!
